Significant infrastructure projects by Cybarco Contracting

On April 30, the new Astromeritis–Evrychou highway was officially opened to traffic by the Department of Public Works.

The project was implemented by the consortium Cybarco–Pharmakas J.V., under the supervision of the Department of Public Works, and was completed within schedule and within the budget of €74,477,000.

It includes the construction of a modern four-lane highway, approximately 11.3 kilometres long. Among other works, a flyover junction was constructed, a terminal roundabout, as well as significant technical infrastructure works, including a 750-metre-long bridge.

The highway is expected to improve road safety and reduce travel time to the mountainous areas of Troodos, Solea, Marathasa, and Pitsilia.

The project also recorded a significant first, as recycled asphalt material was used for the first time in a public project in Cyprus, a choice that reduces construction waste and gives the project a sustainable development character.



Official inauguration ceremony for Limassol Greens - A new integrated destination with a unique identity



Limassol Greens – owned by the Lanitis Group and a group of Maltese investors – held its official inauguration ceremony on Tuesday, June 3, 2026, marking an important milestone in the development of one of Cyprus' major integrated golf and residential projects.

Since opening its doors in October 2025, the resort has started setting a new standard for premium living, golf, recreation, and hospitality, with experiences available throughout the year.

Combining an 18-hole golf course of international standards, luxurious residences, landscaped green areas, lifestyle amenities, as well as wellness and dining facilities, Limassol Greens is evolving into an integrated destination with a unique identity.

The inauguration ceremony brought together government officials, Members of Parliament, Mayors, Ambassadors, businesspeople and other



partners, homeowners, clients, and special guests.

The President of the Republic of Cyprus was represented at the ceremony by the Minister of the Interior, Constantinos Ioannou.

The ceremony opened with a speech by Mr Platon Lanitis, Chairman of the Board of Limassol Greens, who presented the opening as a milestone for the project and as a significant contribution to Cyprus' broader tourism and lifestyle offering.

In his speech, Mr. Lanitis highlighted the expected impact of the project, pointing out that "Limassol Greens is able to make a substantial contribution to the wider local economy, boosting tourism, strengthening Cyprus' international image as a quality destination and authenticity, and helping to reduce the seasonality that has long characterized our tourist product".

Next, Mr Demos Panagiotou, CEO of Limassol Greens, focused on the vision behind the project and its development into a vibrant international community, deeply connected to the character and hospitality of Cyprus.

"The opening of Limassol Greens represents the realization of a vision that started many years ago: creating a fully fledged resort and residential community that combines modern living, wellness, hospitality, nature, and recreation in a single destination," he said.

The ceremony continued with a speech by internationally recognized architect Mr. Luciano Mazza, who talked about the design journey of Limassol Greens and how the project's architecture was shaped by the land itself. In his speech, the Minister of the Interior, Constantinos Ioannou, highlighted the national and regional importance of Limassol Greens, describing it as "an iconic development that reflects the confidence of investors and entrepreneurs in Cyprus and in the future of the country." Mr. Ioannou noted that the project reflects "a modern vision for Cyprus, combining quality tourism, sustainable development, innovation, sports, wellness, and a high quality of life."

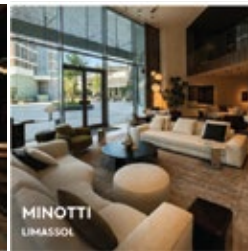


A new destination experience emerges at Trilogy, the new landmark of Limassol
